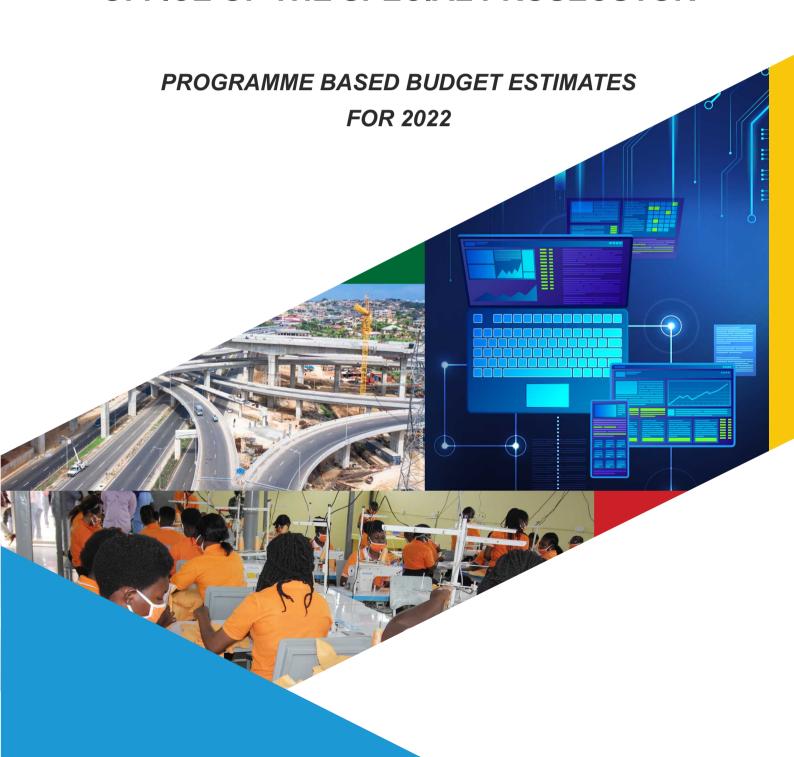

PART A: STRATEGIC OVERVIEW OF THE OFFICE OF THE SPECIAL PROSECUTOR

1. POLICY OBJECTIVES

The NMTDPF contains one Policy Objective relevant to the Office of The Special Prosecutor. This is:

 Promote the fight against corruption and corruption-related offences, and such existing offences under enactments arising out of or consequent to corruption and public procurement offences

2. MISSION

To investigate and prosecute alleged corruption or suspected corruption and corruption-related offences; to recover the proceeds of corruption and corruption-related offences, and take steps to prevent corruption to the end that it promotes good governance, transparency, accountability and probity in Ghana's constitutional governance towards the attainment of the Constitution's preamble aspirations.

3. CORE FUNCTIONS

The core functions of the Office include the following:

- the investigation and prosecution of cases of alleged or suspected corruption and corruption related offences under the Public Procurement Act, 2003 (Act 663);
- investigation and prosecution of cases of alleged corruption and corruption related offences under the Criminal Offences Act, 1960 (Act 29) involving public officers, politically exposed persons and persons in the private sector involved in the commission of the offence;
- investigation and prosecution of cases of alleged or suspected corruption and corruption related offences involving public officers, politically exposed persons and persons in the private sector involved in the commission of the offence under any other relevant law;
- recovery and management of the proceeds of corruption and corruption-related offences;
- taking steps to prevent corruption
- dissemination of information gathered in the course of investigation to competent authorities and other persons the Office considers appropriate;
- co-operation and coordination with competent authorities and other relevant local and international agencies in furtherance of Act 959;
- receipt and investigation of complaints from a person on a matter that involves or may involve corruption and corruption-related offences;
- receipt and action on referrals of investigations of alleged corruption and corruption related offences by Parliament, the Auditor-General, the Commission on Human Rights and Administrative Justice, the Economic and Organized Crime Office and any other public body; and



• the performance of any other functions connected with the objects of the Office.

5. EXPENDITURE TRENDS FOR THE MEDIUM-TERM.

The OSP was allocated GHC124,103,085.00 in 2021. This is made up of GHC43,473,042.00 for Compensation of Employees, GHC50,030,042.00 for Goods and Services and GHC30,000,000.00 for Capital Expenditure.

As at the end of September, 2021 an amount of GHC28,236,495.00 for Goods and Services was released and the OSP utilized only GHC6,110,487.00 out of it. The OSP has also received a Commencement Certificate to utilize the total amount of the budgeted GHC30,000,000.00 for Capital Expenditure for 2021.

The office was unable to do much in the year under review with its budget allocation mainly due to its inability to move into its allocate office and recruit staff.

Barely a month after the assumption of office of the new Special Prosecutor, the OSP has moved into its own office and a lot of work is currently going on with the resources available to partition the office and recruit staff to operationalize it.

6. ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2021

As a result of the challenges and the limitations posed by the limited office space and the inability to employ requisite staff the office has not been able to do much within the period under review.

Coupled with the above was the resignation of the first Special Prosecutor in November 2020. The Office was without a substantive Special Prosecutor for about nine (9) months until the assumption of office of the new Special Prosecutor in August 2021. This development has delayed to a very large extent the process of operationalization the office.

However, complaints and petitions which were received from the public were also replied to indicating actions to be taken while investigations commenced on most of them.

Since August 2021, the new Special Prosecutor has been taking concrete steps to operationalize the office.

In September 2021 the OSP moved out of its rented premises at Labone and has since occupied the assigned GETFUND building.
