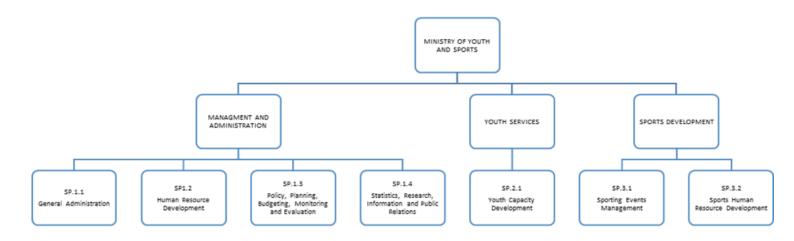

- Build capacity for sports and recreational development.
- Ensure sustainable funding sources for growth and development of sports.

2. GOAL

To contribute to the attainment of national integration, sustained macro-economic stability, peace, healthy population and SDGs through youth development and empowerment, and promotion of sports.

3. CORE FUNCTIONS

The Ministry's core functions are to:

- Initiate and formulate policies, taking into account the needs and aspirations of the relevant stakeholders.
- Co-ordinate, monitor and evaluate the effectiveness and efficient performance of the Sector.
- Develop comprehensive policy framework to guide international collaboration and cooperation in the Youth and Sports sector.
- Oversee the regulation of the sports and youth sector.
- Create enabling environment for all-inclusive Youth and Sports development.
- Facilitate the provision of the state-of-the-art infrastructure for youth and sports development.
- Facilitate the capacity development of youth and sports.
- Promote research and development into youth and sports.
- Undertake any other functions conducive for the achievement of the objective of the sector.

5. EXPENDITURE TREND OF THE MINISTRY OF YOUTH AND SPORTS

In 2020, a total budget amount of Forty Million, Two Hundred and Forty Four Thousand, One Hundred and Fifty Five Ghana Cedis Only (GH¢40,244,155.00) was allocated for the operations of the sector which constituted a decrease of 8% over the 2019 total allocation. It comprised Eighteen Million and Eighteen Thousand, Four Hundred and Three Ghana Cedis Only (GH¢18,018,403.00) for Compensation of Employees, Nineteen Million, Six Hundred and Ninety One Thousand, Five Hundred and Eleven Ghana Cedis Only (GH¢19,691,511.00) for Goods and Services, Two Million Ghana Cedis (GH¢2,000,000.00) for Capex, and Five Hundred and Thirty-Four Thousand, Two Hundred and Forty One Ghana Cedi Only (GH¢534,241.00) as Internally Generated Funds.

A budget amount of Thirty Four Million, Four Hundred and Twelve Thousand, Eight Hundred and Five Ghana Cedis (GH¢34,412,805.00) was allocated to the sector in 2021.

This amount comprised Nineteen Million, Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand, Eight Hundred and Sixty Seven Ghana Cedis (19,250,867.00) for Compensation of Employees, Twelve Million, Four Hundred and Ten Thousand, One Hundred and Seventy One Ghana Cedi (GH¢12,410,171.00) for Goods and Services, Two Million and Three Hundred Thousand



(GH¢2,300,000.00) for Capex, and Four Hundred and Fifty-One Thousand, Seven Hundred and Sixty-Eight Ghana Cedis (GH¢451,768.00) as Internally Generated Funds.

For Budget year 2022, an amount of Three Hundred and Eighteen Million, Three Hundred and Twenty Nine Thousand Ghana Cedis Only (GH¢ 318,329,000.00) was allocated to the Ministry. Out of this amount, Twenty Six Million, Five Hundred and Fourteen Thousand Ghana Cedis (GH¢26,514,000.00) was allocated for Compensation of Employees, Goods and Services comprised Twenty Eight Million, Six Hundred and Eighty Seven Thousand Ghana Cedis (GH¢28,687,000.00). CAPEX was allocated an amount of Fifty Five Million, One Hundred and Ten Thousand Ghana Cedis Only (GH¢55,110,000.00). Four Hundred and Seventy Nine Thousand Ghana Cedis (GH¢479,000.00) was allocated as Internally Generated Funds and Two Hundred and Seven Million, Five Hundred and Thirty Nine Thousand Ghana Cedis Only for Development Partner (DP) Funds (GH¢207,539,000.00).

During the 2022 mid-year fiscal policy review, the Ministry's allocation for Goods & Services and CAPEX were revised to Seventy Eight Million, Six Hundred and Eighty-Seven Thousand Ghana Cedis Only (GH¢78,687,000.00) and Five Million, One Hundred and Ten Thousand Ghana Cedis Only (GH¢5,110,000.00) respectively. Compensation, IGF and DP funds of the Ministry remained unchanged.

For 2023, the budgeted allocation to the Ministry is Three Hundred and Ninety-Five Million, Seven Hundred and Twenty-Three Thousand, Two Hundred and Sixty One Ghana Cedi Only (GH¢ 395,723,261.00). This represents a growth rate of 24.31% with respect to the 2022 budgeted allocation of Three Hundred and Eighteen Million, Three Hundred and Twenty Nine Thousand Ghana Cedis Only (GH¢318,329,000.00). IGF increased from Four Hundred and Seventy-Nine Thousand Ghana Cedis Only (GH¢479,000.00) in 2022 to Three Million, Six Hundred and Thirty-Four Thousand, Ninety-Nine Ghana Cedis Only (GH¢3,634,099.00) in 2023 representing a growth of 658.68%. Development Partner's component of the allocation increased from Two Hundred and Seven Million, Five Hundred and Thirty Nine Thousand Ghana Cedis Only (GH¢207,539,000.00) in 2022 to Three Hundred and Forty Seven Million, Six Hundred Thousand Ghana Cedis Only (GH¢347,600,000.00) in 2023 for the Construction of sporting facilities for the successful hosting and organisation of the 13th African Games, Accra 2023 and maintenance of the Cape Coast Stadium.

Under GoG, Compensation of Employees increased from Twenty Six Million, Five Hundred and Fourteen Thousand Ghana Cedis ($GH\phi26,514,000.00$) in 2022 to Twenty Eight Million, One Hundred and Four Thousand, Eight Hundred and Forty Ghana Cedis Only ($GH\phi28,104,840.00$) in 2023 indicating a 6% growth while Goods and Services decreased from Twenty Eight Million, Six Hundred and Eighty Seven Thousand Ghana Cedis ($GH\phi28,687,000.00$) in 2022 to Fourteen Million, Seven Hundred and Four Thousand, Five Hundred and Seventy Five Ghana Cedis Only ($GH\phi14,704,575.00$) in 2023 signifying a decline of 48.74% growth. Capital Expenditure (CAPEX) for 2023 declined by about (96.95%) compared to 2022 allocation.



6. SUMMARY OF KEY ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2022.

The following were achieved in 2022 under the three (3) programmes of the Ministry.

MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION PROGRAMME

Performance of National Football Teams

The Senior National Team, the Black Stars of Ghana has successfully qualified to the 2022 FIFA World Cup Tournament in Qatar. The team scored their Nigerian counterparts to secure a spot in the 2022 World cup.

The four-time African Champions will battle Portugal and Uruguay as well as South Korea in Group H and has currently played three friendly matches against Brazil, Nicaragua and Switzerland as part of preparations for the Tournament.

2022 Commonwealth Games, Birmingham UK

Team Ghana successfully participated in the 2022 Commonwealth Games in Birmingham, UK from 27th July to 8th August, 2022 and won a total of five (5) medals comprising two (2) silver and three (3) bronze.

- Abraham Mensah and Joseph Commey won a silver medal each in boxing in the bantamweight (over 51 54kg) and featherweight (over 54 57kg) respectively,
- Abdul Wahid Omar (Light Welterweight over 60 63.5kg) picked a bronze medal.
- Joseph Paul Amoah and Deborah Acquah won a bronze medal each in 200 metres and long jump respectively in athletics

The National Youth Authority successfully launched the 2022-2032 National Youth Policy and Implementation on 12th August, 2022 at the first National Youth Conference held at Anagkazo, Akwapem Mampong in the Eastern Region to climax the 2022 International Youth Day Celebration. The Special Guest of Honour was The President of the Republic of Ghana, H. E Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo.

Speaking at the conference and launch of the National Youth Policy, the President emphasized the need for Africa's investment in the development of its human capital, to ensure the accelerated growth of the continent. He admonished the youth against engaging in rebellious and unproductive activities, even in the midst of seemingly challenging times of unemployment; as the government is striving to create the right environment for the youth to thrive and contribute to the socio-economic gains of the country.

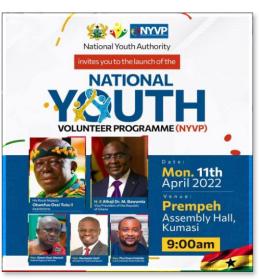

Successful launch of the National Youth Volunteer Programme (NYVP)

The National Youth Authority successfully launched the NYVP, this Programme is designed to coordinate volunteer activities in the country and seeks to implement thirteen (13) Modules with an objective of developing active citizens, foster national cohesion and creating opportunities for skills development among young people.





As a sequel to the launch of the NYVP in April 2022, the Authority has taken the necessary steps to roll out three modules: Youth in Development Work, Gender Mainstreaming and Infrastructure Volunteers, in some selected communities in the country by the end of December, 2022. Hence, in line with the deployment process, an orientation and training workshop was held at Bedtime Hotel, Koforidua from 13th -17th September, 2022 for two batches of four hundred and fifty-eight (458) prospective volunteers drawn from the sixteen (16) regions of the country, to equip them with the requisite skills and mindset for their assignment to the respective communities across the country.

Annual National Youth Conference

A maiden Annual National Youth Conference was held to coincide with the commemoration of this year's International Youth Day and the launching of the National Youth Policy. The conference attracted 500 participants from across the country to express their views on prevailing youth development issues and exchange purposeful ideas as a way of encouraging the youth to take active part in national discourse.

The Authority facilitated the participation of four (4) young people comprising one (1) male and three (3) females at the Commonwealth Youth Forum (CYF) in Kigali, Rwanda from 19th – 21st June, 2022. The CYF is a usual side event of the biennial Commonwealth Heads of Governments Meeting (CHOGM) which offers young people the opportunity to deliberate and present the youth perspectives on topical ideals and concerns of the Commonwealth.

Skills Towards Employability and Productivity (STEP) Programme:

In line with the National Youth Authority's mandate to empower young people in the country; and pursuant to its flagship STEP Programme, which aims to enable young people acquire relevant hard and soft skills for entrepreneurial and employment opportunities in the country and beyond, the inmates of the Senior Correctional Centre were also targeted.

Consequently, a ten (10) day Online Digital Marketing training was organized for some selected Officers and Inmates at the Senior Correctional Centre, Ridge, Accra, from $12^{th} - 23^{rd}$ September, 2022 to ensure that, especially the inmates, acquire relevant knowledge and skills in digital literacy to enhance their chances of securing meaningful employment opportunities after their stay at the Centre.

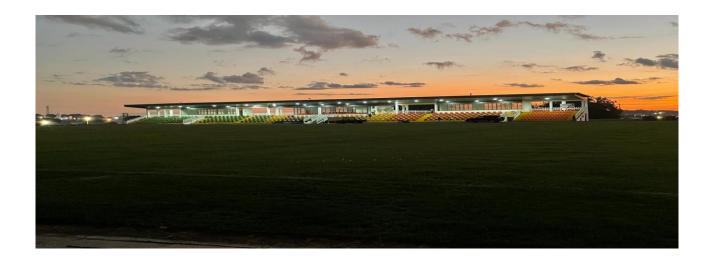


Registration of Youth Groups

Pursuant to section 25 of ACT 939, the National Youth Authority has updated its records of registered youth-led and youth-focused groups nationwide to one thousand, five hundred ninety-six (1,596) and has subsequently certificated and accredited four hundred (400) youth groups across the country.

Youth Resource Centres

Continuation of the construction of ten (10) Youth Resource Centres are ongoing; meanwhile, progress of works have reached an average level of fifty per cent (50%) of second phase of five (5) Youth Resource Centres at Axim, Dormaa-Ahenkro, Dunkwa-on-Offin, Koforidua and Wa respectively. Additionally, works are progressing steadily on Youth Friendly and Recreational Centres at Tuba-Bortianor and Mamponteng in the Greater Accra and Ashanti Regions respectively.

This will be achieved through provision of both soft-skills and vocational skills training under the Skills Towards Employability and Productivity (STEP) Programme, and Leadership and Governance at Afienya. It also includes organisation of National Youth Awards and participation in International Youth events as well as coordination of public education, sensitization, and counselling services for the youth in all the districts of the country.

The sub-programme also provides entrepreneurship and short-term hands-on-training for vulnerable youth annually throughout the country. The Organisational units involved in the delivery of this sub-programme are the National, Regional, and District Secretariats of the National Youth Authority (NYA) as well as the Youth Centre for Excellence.

The sub-programme will be funded through Government of Ghana (GOG) Annual Budgetary allocations and the main beneficiaries are the youth of Ghana.

Management

1. Budget Sub-Programme Objectives

- Provide the sports sector with sports facilities and equipment in all regions, districts and communities.
- Provide the technical human resource support for sports development

2. Budget Sub-Programme Description

This Sub-programme provides the overall planning needs of sports infrastructure in the country. It aims at renovating all old sports infrastructure across the country to bring them up to international standards. Provision of vehicles and sports equipment like hockey sticks, soccer balls etc.

This aims to ensure that all the sixteen (16) Regions of Ghana have state-of-the-art multipurpose courts, halls and playing fields to develop and promote sports in the country. Currently, Great Accra, Ashanti, Western, Central and Northern Regions have stadia and it is planned in the short term that the other regions will also have these stadia. Other sporting facilities and equipment will be provided nationwide.

This sub programme again co-ordinates with stakeholders (districts, communities and corporate bodies) for infrastructure development. The stakeholders such as District Assemblies, Communities and corporate bodies are partnered to assist in the acquisition of land, sponsorship by corporate bodies, supervision of the project by the Ministry and its Agencies as well as management and maintenance of facilities.

This sub-programme also seeks to provide capacity building through training to develop technical and administrative competencies of staff (coaches, sports development officers, estate officer, stores keepers etc.). This sub-programme is delivered by the National Sports College, Winneba, National Sports Authority and its Regional and Districts offices and has total employee's strength of Five Hundred and Sixty-five (565). It's funded by Government to the benefit of people in the regions, districts and communities.

It does this by developing training content and organizing courses for various sports disciplines, identifies young boys and girls and takes them into residential academy programmes where they are given regular academic education as well as sports training.

The sub-programme engages and works in collaboration with other local and international entities with similar objects. It also accommodates and makes available camping and training facilities for national sports contingents and private sports groups like Ghana Football Association (GFA) clubs.

The beneficiaries of the Sports Human Resource and Facility Development sub-programme include:

- Teachers of Ghana Education Service;
- Coaches of various sports associations;
- Tertiary institutions especially Physical education students of University of Education, Winneba;

- National sports contingents.



The technical department of the National Sports College together with all the other support services are involved in the delivery of the programmes. Altogether, forty (40) officers are involved in programme delivery and is funded by Government of Ghana.
